

Creation of a Common Resource Pool Portal for engaging Young Professionals, Consultants etc. for 5 Departments-regarding.

It has been decided to create a Common Resource Pool Portal to engage Young Professionals, Consultants and similar roles for five Government Departments i.e. Ministry of Textiles, Department of Commerce, Department of Consumer Affairs, Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade and the Department of Food and Public Distribution on an ongoing basis throughout the year. The portal has been made operational. The Common Resource Pool Portal can be accessed via the URL: <https://crpp.dpiit.gov.in>. The key features of the portal are outlined below:

- i. The portal will serve as a common resource pool accessible to all the five departments. However, the selection process will be conducted independently by each department based on their specific needs and guidelines.
- ii. Candidates can register and upload their details on the portal at any time. They also have the option to update their applications. A user manual with screenshots is available for reference.
- iii. The validity of a candidate's application is six months. After this period, it will be archived. Candidates wishing to renew their application can do so using their archived data.
- iv. Eligibility and selection criteria for Young Professionals, Consultants and Subject Matter Experts will be clearly outlined by each respective department. Updates may be provided on the department's website or other chosen mediums.
- v. The status of a candidate's application, such as "Submitted", "Under Consideration" , "Shortlisted" and "Selected" will be displayed to all the stakeholders of the portal.
- vi. Each department will be able to utilize search and filter criteria to scrutinize eligible candidates from the common pool. The departments can devise their own methods for assessing shortlisted candidates.
- vii. After initial screening, the department reserves the right to call only the necessary number of candidates for further selection processes. Additionally, the department may cancel the candidature of any individual found ineligible or providing false information at any stage.
- viii. It's important to note that submission and meeting minimum eligibility criteria

do not guarantee shortlisting or selection for any engagement in the five departments.
